BUILDING BRIDGES – MAKING WAVES

Welcome to the 22nd New Mills One World Festival.

The One World Festival is the High Peak's major free festival for peace, development and the environment. It provides a focus for groups and organisations campaigning to raise awareness and involve people in global and local issues, encouraging everyone to contribute and help make a difference in the challenges facing us all. The One World Festival was started by CND groups in New Mills, Glossop and Marple to demonstrate the links between an escalating nuclear arms race, world poverty and the environment. These issues remain relevant over two decades later. The theme of this year's festival is **Building Bridges - Making Waves**. The festival will focus on how people and groups both in our local community and around the world can work together during the current economic crisis, providing support for each other and looking towards the future to ensure positive change can occur. We have three speakers who will be presenting on the theme:

- Non-violent direct action has been used throughout history to challenge governments and laws which are inadequate or unjust, from the US Civil Rights movement to the suffragettes. In the face of runaway climate change **Manchester Airport on Trial** will be speaking about the contribution of aviation to this, the expansion of Manchester Airport and the use of direct action as an effective campaigning tactic.
- **New Mills Young Women's Group** provides an environment where women can come together, support each other and develop new skills. The group has produced a DVD on teenage pregnancy, raises money for charity and seeks to engage the community in local projects.
- A representative of **Quaker Living Witness** will speak about their links with and support for a Zambian community group, the Kamanga Dance Ensemble (KADE), with their educational project on environmental education.

A wide range of campaign groups, charities and other not-for-profit organisations is also represented here today. Please take some time to visit their stalls and find out about their work. Some of the stalls featured include **Child Poverty Action, Oxfam, High Peak Women's Aid, Torrs Hydro, and Buxton Transition**.

We have a fantastic line-up of music this year, featuring local bands and others from further afield. There will be a good mix of music styles to satisfy all tastes.

A SPECIAL FEATURE OF THIS YEAR'S FESTIVAL IS THE OPPORTUNITY FOR ANY AGE TO PARTICIPATE IN FREE INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOPS – AFRO-BRAZILIAN PERCUSSION WITH **PERCUSSION4U** AND AFRICAN DANCE WITH **AFROCATS**. SIGN UP ON THE DAY ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVED BASIS IN THE PARK. NUMBERS ARE LIMITED. THE WORKSHOPS WILL TAKE PLACE IN ST MARY'S PARISH HALL (ATTACHED TO ST MARY'S CHURCH OF THE ANNUNCIATION) OPPOSITE THE PARK.

In addition... **Reforma Dance Theatre Company** will be performing their upbeat dance break, following their performance, *My Place*, in the Torrs earlier in the day with 60 young people from the High Peak: "giving young people a chance to see local spaces in a new creative light...to embrace and preserve them in the future".
